Sussman Award Presentation - Monday, June 5th at 3-4pm EST

"Remaining Land-Grant Fierce While Accepting the Land-Grab Truth of Our Foundation" Dr. Stephen Gavazzi

Dr. Gavazzi will present his research on "land grab" universities, the impact on tribal communities, and steps toward atonement. This important work is of interest to Groves members and aligns well with this year's focus on Lakota culture.

Stephen M. Gavazzi, Ph.D. is a Professor in the Department of Human Sciences and is Director of CHRR at The Ohio State University, Ohio State's center for data and survey excellence. Dr. Gavazzi is known for his work on a variety of higher education issues. His book Land-Grant Universities for the Future (co-authored with E. Gordon Gee) was published in 2018 by Johns Hopkins University Press. Gavazzi and Gee also are coauthors of the book What's Public About Public Higher Ed? That was published in

About Groves Academy and Lifetime Members

(Reprinted from Groves Monograph Volume 2)

There is some evidence of the Conference making awards on an ad hoc

basis. Following the 1968 reorganization, Gladys H. Groves continued to be recognized as honorary director on our letterhead and at annual meetings (Settles, 1971, 1978). A letter of recognition prepared by Dr. Sussman to Edith Grotberg for her contribution to family and child policy and programs was prepared and presented at the 1979 Washington conference on family policy (Settles, 1979). In 1980 a discussion and proposal for member recognition resulted in these two new awards: Lifetime membership and Groves Academy membership. In 1981 Harold Feldman and Marvin Sussman were given life membership, and David Mace was the first Groves Academy member. In 1984 Marie Peters was recognized posthumously. She had been our second Groves membership chair and was a leader in her commitment to diversity for the conference and used our informal format to help build relationships.

account of the history of indigenous rights and treaties in North America. He notes the portrayal of indigenous peoples in popular media as having contributed greatly to public knowledge of North American Indians. The book was chosen in alignment with this year's conference which is an immersive

experience learning about the Lakota on Pine Ridge Reservation in South Dakota. As facilitator, Dr. Sandy Lookabaugh led the group in a lively and thought-provoking discussion that resulted in the generation of resources (books, movies, podcasts, etc.) related to Indigenous Families.
